

The Rt Revd Philip Mountstephen Bishop of Truro

Philip Mounstephen has been Bishop of Truro since late 2018.

Prior to that he led Church Mission Society as well as churches in both

London and Paris (but not at the same time).

He is married to Ruth and father of Kitty.

His hobbies include collecting vinyl albums and walking Noggin the dog.



The Most Reverend Kay Goldsworthy AO Archbishop of the Anglican Diocese of Perth and Metropolitan of Western Australia

Archbishop Kay was born and called to ministry in the Diocese of Melbourne.

She was ordained Deaconess in 1984 and Deacon in 1986

and served in parishes in Melbourne.

In 1988 she was appointed Chaplain to Perth College and was among the first women in Australia to be ordained to the priesthood by Archbishop Peter Carnley on 7 March 1992.

Kay was appointed Assistant Bishop by Archbishop Roger Herft and was the first woman ordained to the episcopate in Australia on 22 May 2008.

She was elected as the diocesan bishop of the Diocese of Gippsland and installed on 21 March 2015.

In 2017 Kay was appointed an Officer of the Order of Australia (AO) for 'distinguished service to religion through the Anglican Church of Australia, as a pioneer and role model for women, to church administration, and to pastoral care and equality'.

Kay was elected as the Eighth Archbishop of Perth and installed on 10 February 2018 - the first female archbishop in the Anglican Church of Australia.



The Rt Revd Nigel Stock

Nigel Stock was ordained in 1976.

After a curacy in the Diocese of Durham he was a parish priest in Papua New Guinea for five years.

He returned to the North East of England, this time to the Diocese of Newcastle where he was incumbent first of Shiremoor and then North Shields and Rural Dean of Tynemouth.

After a short period as a residentiary canon of Durham Cathedral he became suffragan bishop of Stockport in the Diocese of Chester in 2000 and then in 2007 the Bishop of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

In 2013 he moved to Lambeth Palace in support of the current Archbishop of Canterbury as Bishop at Lambeth,

Bishop to the Forces and Bishop for the Falkland Islands.

He retired in September 2017 and lives in Somerset with his wife Carolyne. They have three sons and four grandchildren.
